The congregation numbers were small, only about forty people in attendance that day but the welcome was warm and enthusiastic. The church is old and spacious, with a large gallery at the back — the sound system broke down but our GPC-trained kids projected like the professionals they are. Stephen Chambers preached on Genesis 22:1-19, The Sacrifice of Isaac. He spoke well and challenged us all to a life of greater commitment to Jesus.

We gave Cheryl a framed copy of the Changemaker artwork that the young people had previously made and said our farewells, heading off to Balbriggan beach for the next exciting instalment of fun in the sun — swimming, spike ball and frisbee.

Our tired but happy bunch arrived back at GPC on Sunday evening with strengthened faith, friendships and enthusiasm for all that lies ahead for ROOTS in the new term.

I am immensely proud of these young people who are a joy to be around. The leadership team of Stephen, Laura, Alan, Gareth, Lara and Aimee are a top team full of enthusiasm and talent. ROOTS meets on Sunday mornings during church and is for young people P7 and over. We are looking forward to the fun and craic in the year ahead, all the time growing in our faith as we learn about God together.

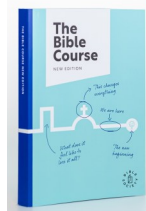

There is something quietly special about Monday mornings in the Styé Brae.

As the doors open and the kettle begins to sing a gentle rhythm settles in - the familiar get together known simply as Drop-in. For an hour each week the hall fills with the warmth of conversation, laughter and fellowship wrapped in the comforting aroma of coffee and freshly baked scones.

Friends greet each other with easy smiles and a welcoming word to newcomers. The simple pleasure of sharing a scone becomes something more meaningful. In a world that often feels rushed and stressful, Drop-In offers a pause - a space where time is measured not in minutes but in moments shared.

This group is also marked by the quiet generosity flowing through it. A few coins exchanged for a coffee and scone may seem small yet over time these modest contributions have mounted up enabling generous contributions to be donated to a variety of good causes such as The Shankill Glaucoma centre, Samaritan gift boxes and Fire Lily gift boxes.

There is no grand ceremony, no expectation just a shared understanding that giving can make a difference. But perhaps the greatest gift of Drop-In is the sense of community and belonging it creates.

It reminds us that connections matter, that stories are worth sharing and a welcoming smile is never wasted.

Whether you come for the coffee, the company or simply a change of scene, you will find a place waiting for you.

You may even be fortunate to glimpse that rarest of sights a grown man doing the dishes!

They meet in the Upper Styne Brae Hall 2.15-3.45pm. (Lift access available).

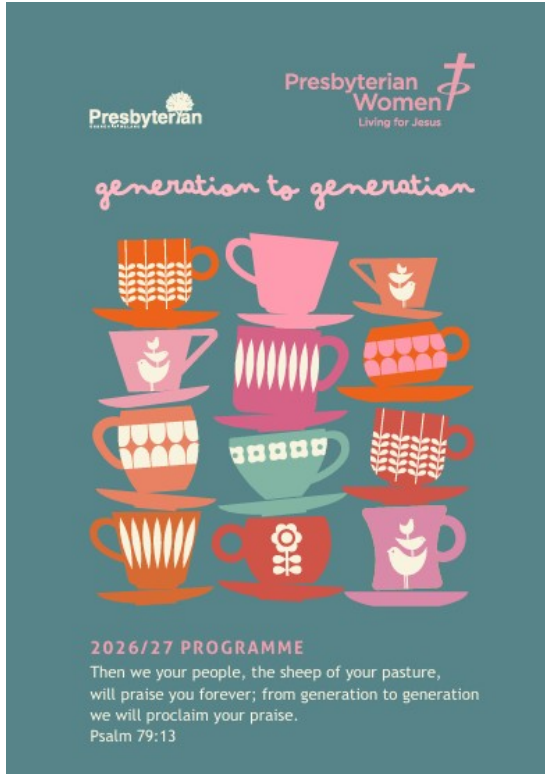
